




Hope in Action: An Initiative for Girls & Child Safety

26th September - 1st October 2024

From 26th September to 1st October 2024, Aan Charitable Trust will spearhead a weeklong outreach campaign in U.S. Nagar, Uttarakhand, tackling pressing social issues in rural communities. The initiative will champion child safety through awareness on safe and unsafe touch, advance menstrual hygiene and SRHR education, and reintegrate adolescent girls into education via the Kishori Uchh Shiksha Protsahan Yojna. Reaching over 900 children and families, the campaign calls upon communities, organizations, and CSR leaders to unite for transformative impact.





Aan Secures Support For Nuh District

Aan Joins Hands for Nuh's Youth

4th April 2025 Aan Charitable Trust recently met with Sh. Aashish Kumar Sharma, City Magistrate of Nuh, and Kusum Malik, FLN Coordinator and Nodal Officer for NIPUN Nuh, to discuss integrated strategies for improving child health, safety, and foundational learning in Punhana and Nuh two aspirational blocks in urgent need of support. The meeting included Mr. Deepak, JSP Fellow from Magic Bus India Foundation, and Mr. Dhananjay Rathi. ACT presented its brochure and concept note, highlighting a multidimensional approach to education, menstrual hygiene, and adolescent well-being. The discussion marked a strong step toward collaborative, district-level action for child empowerment.





Aan Leads 3-Day Outreach Program in Punhana & Nuh

4th April

Aan Charitable Trust, in collaboration with the Piramal Foundation, conducted a focused three-day empowerment drive from 22nd to 24th April 2024 in the Punhana block, Nuh district, Haryana. Responding to low female literacy and rising dropout rates, the initiative addressed child safety, adolescent and menstrual health, and access to Open and Distance Learning (ODL). The campaign reached over 500 children and families across three government schools, providing vital knowledge and resources. ACT remains committed to building safe, informed, and inclusive communities across rural Nuh.





ACT Marks Menstrual Hygiene Day in Sohna & Punhana

28th & 30th May

To mark International Menstrual Hygiene Day, Aan Charitable Trust held a two-day workshop in Ghamroj (Sohna) and Nai Village (Punahna), Haryana, engaging over 270 adolescent girls and mothers. In partnership with Project Baala, Piramal Foundation, and Magic Bus Foundation, the sessions offered safe, stigma-free spaces to discuss menstrual health and distribute sustainable kits. Held at Rajkiya Kanya Varishth Madhyamik Vidyalaya, the workshop empowered girls for the first time to speak openly about periods, reinforcing that menstrual dignity is a right, not a privilege.
